A Moment with Mike

As we enter into the Advent and Christmas season, I am struck by how busy this time of year can be for many. Advent is meant to be a time of reflection, similar to Lent, but with holiday preparations, gift buying, work holiday gatherings, and extra events at school, in the community, and in the church, it may be hard to spend much time in reflection. Like it or not, this is a time of extra events and hurrying here and there. It's not that we don't like these special events, but things can get a little hectic, and not everything always goes according to plan.

Even though the first Christmas so long ago was nothing like our Christmas season today, it was anything but peaceful, reflective, or according to plan. The story of Mary and Joseph and the birth of their first son, Jesus, is anything but according to plan! I do not know if they had their lives all planned out, but they certainly would have had assumptions about how life would go and the order in which things would happen. They certainly would not have foreseen that she would become pregnant before marriage, that they would both have to travel a great distance in her third trimester of pregnancy for tax purposes, or that the baby would be ready to come at one of the most inconvenient times conceivable. Indeed, the Christmas story is filled with surprises, and not always the good kind from a human perspective! I invite you to join us for worship during the Advent season as we look at the Christmas story for all of the surprises it contains. Just as God surprised Mary and Joseph in a big way, God can also surprise us, if we are open to it.

In addition to our regular Advent activities, I want to make sure you know about a special service we will have on December 21st, called a Blue Christmas service. Blue Christmas services have become more widespread in America in recent years. This service is meant to acknowledge that, for many people, this season is difficult. For you, Christmas may be difficult for a number of reasons. You may have lost a loved one, you may have broken family relationships, or you may have lost a job, and so you do not feel you can celebrate the same way you used to be able to do. Perhaps there isn't a big reason that you can pinpoint, but you just don't feel jolly.

Whatever the reason may be, you feel the pressure from the outside world and even the church that this is a time in which you should be happy. What if you aren't?

Our Blue Christmas service is meant to acknowledge that the holidays are not always merry for everyone. During the service, we will sing some of the more reflective Christmas hymns, we will read responsive readings that acknowledge the struggle, and I will share a message about how to approach the holidays when you are struggling. We will end by singing "Silent Night" by candlelight, just like at our Christmas Eve service. Hopefully, you will feel a sense of peace and hope in the midst of your struggles.

However you approach the holiday season—whether you love it or struggle with it—may God bless us as we go through this season together.
