A Moment with Mike

August 31st marked the conclusion of the longest sermon series I have ever done. For the last four months, we have been going through the Bible, looking at the major themes and ideas. Thank you for tuning in, either in person or online. Throughout the series, I have tried to share with you the main ideas that God let his children tell the story and that Jesus is our interpretive key for understanding the rest of scripture. You may have noticed that some of these sermons have been longer in length than usual, due in part to the large amount of scripture covered in each sermon in order to fit the series in a span of four months. This series was also more on the intellectual side, sharing scholarly views and theories on the Bible itself. Hopefully you have found this series beneficial to your understanding of the Bible and how best to read it.

In September, we will be switching gears as we begin our new sermon series, in which we will be looking at a new vision for The United Methodist Church. Our mission remains the same, which is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, based on Matthew 28:16-20. A vision statement describes how we, as a denomination, are to fulfill our mission. In the past year, our Council of Bishops released a new vision statement. This new vision states that, "[t]he United Methodist Church forms disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in local communities and worldwide connections." They further break this vision down into three principles.

Love Boldly: Passionately love God and, like Jesus, embrace and include people of every age, nation, race, gender, and walk of life (Matt. 22:37-39 and John 13:34-35).

Serve Joyfully: With a Christ-like heart, journey alongside the most vulnerable, offering care and compassion with joy (Psalm 100:1, Nehemiah 8:10, John 13:14-15).

Lead Courageously: Follow Jesus' example by resisting and dismantling all systems of evil, injustice, and oppression, striving for peace, justice, and reconciliation (Joshua 1:9 and Ephesians 6:10).

In this sermon series, we will take a close look at this vision statement and what it could mean for our local church as we seek ways to live this out in our local context. This is something you can actually help us with. In our next administrative council meeting in October, we will be filling out forms for our annual charge conference meeting. One of these forms asks us to set specific, measurable goals for what we want to focus on in 2026. As we prepare to do this, we value your input. Therefore, if you have an idea of something our church could be doing to serve our congregation and/or the needs of our local or global community that you feel would align with this new vision statement, I encourage you to let either me or Nicci know in the office. Submitted ideas will then be discussed at our October administrative council meeting. Working together, I know we can make our community and our world a better place.


Fall Seven-Week Small Group Study Exodus for Normal People







