We had 76 kids registered this year, and as you can see from the pictures in the newsletter and on our Facebook page, a lot of planning and preparation went into this year's program.

I am thankful to our many volunteers, including Heidi Gerstandt, Miranda Cook, Brenda DeRoo, and Steph Rochleau for taking on much of the leadership coordinator duties to oversee the big picture. Our station leaders, including Linda Appleby and Linda Burkhart with science, Roni Timmerman, Dixie Carper, Mikayla Kinnetz, and Madi Stief with Bible stories, Jason and Miranda Cook with games, and Steph Rochleau with crafts, are greatly appreciated. Beyond that, we had people keeping watch at the doors, registering kids as they came, cooking and serving food to over 100 people each day, running the sound booth, acting in the opening and closing skits, cutting out stickers, assisting the station leaders, leading the groups of kids from one station to another, and using their creativity to decorate the church for the theme of V.B.S., which was "Road Trip: On the Go With God."

I am sure there is more that I am forgetting to mention, but the main idea is that a lot of dedicated people of all ages have come together to make this a very organized, well done Vacation Bible School. Due to the heart and soul all these people put into Vacation Bible School, I believe we have a reputation in our community of having a well done program that welcomes all with great hospitality and the love of Jesus.

As we finish out the summer season in August, we will be wrapping up our Bible study, called "Genesis for Normal People," and final preparations will be made to begin our fall ministries, including Sunday School, our fall Bible study, called "Exodus for Normal People," our music ministries resuming, including our bell choir and chancel choir, and Teen Time. With a great congregation working together, the future is bright at St. Paul's!

I studied voice, sang in the Duomo choir and at the American Church, and made lifelong friends. After two years I returned to the States, ready to move forward in my life.

Church coffee hour? Fellowship like that can change your life. It did mine.

Lord, I give thanks for all those opportunities of fellowship. Help me give them to others.

Join us for Fellowship




Together we gather as a community of believers and church family on Sundays after worship in Schuldt Dining Hall. There is always a fresh pot of hot coffee and delicious snacks





Fall Seven-Week Small Group Study Exodus for Normal People
