

A Moment with Mike

Each year, the Iowa Conference of the United Methodist Church has an annual meeting, called Annual Conference. This year's meeting was held in a hybrid format, which means some attended online and others in person, on June 4th and 5th. Linda Burkhart and I both attended virtually. What follows is a summary of what took place at this year's meeting.

Since our current bishop is still recovering from a concussion, our previous bishop, Bishop Trimble, led the conference. After opening worship, a number of different business items and ministry reports were received. Many of the conference ministries gave a report, including our two camps and Cokesbury. The budget for the conference for the next year was approved with a slight increase in the total amount, though the budget still reflects a much smaller amount than just a few years ago. The board of pensions met to discuss the state of clergy pension accounts and health insurance. The United Methodist Foundation also met to share their report as well as services they offer local churches, including investment opportunities and workshops, such as how to leave the church money in your will.

Each year, there is legislation to be passed, most of which was non-controversial. Of note, there was one church in our conference (Agency United Methodist Church) that went through the process of disaffiliation, and this was officially ratified at the conference. There was some discussion on what the requirements should be for disaffiliation, with some thinking that the requirements were too expensive for many churches to afford, but this is ultimately a decision that only the General Conference (worldwide legislative body) can change. In another piece of legislation, the discontinuance of the Drake Wesley Foundation was regrettably approved.

Towards the end of the conference, we had a fixing of appointments ceremony. This is where the district superintendents announce which churches are receiving new pastoral appointments; however, this is known by the impacted churches and pastors ahead of time. We also had a worship service on Sunday morning, during which candidates for licensed ministry and ordained ministry were approved.

Now that Annual Conference is past, we look ahead to the new appointment year with hope. This past year was a good one for us in Cherokee, with many victories to celebrate as we restarted many of our ministries. Much of what we have accomplished this year is thanks to all of us working together to make a difference. May we continue our mission of making disciples in the 2022-2023 appointment year with hope for what Jesus is doing in our midst!


