This past month has been a good one, as we have been getting to know many of you through individual and group visits, meetings, worship, and fellowship. I look forward to continuing this in August, so we will continue to have sign-ups in the back of the sanctuary for visits. If you do not think any of the suggested times will work for a visit, feel free to call me to set up a time that works for you.

During my visits, I usually ask two questions. I want to know what you like best about the church and what you would like to see for the church in the future. For most, the answers to both questions are the same. It is apparent that many of you value the sense of community you get in our church. There is a sense of support you get from sharing life together, and that is a valuable aspect of church life that we want to continue to foster.

Most of you state that for the future of the church, you would like to see younger families in our community of faith. This is an important goal, because having new people (of any age) means we are continuing to make new disciples of Jesus Christ. Having younger people will ensure that this church continues to make disciples for generations to come.

The issue of how to get younger people to come to church and why fewer are coming in the first place is a multifaceted one, including local and societal dynamics that have been going on for the last sixty years or so. I have been pastoring churches since 2003, and every church I have served has struggled with this issue, so we are hardly alone. There are no simple answers or formulas to get people to come to church, but it is something we can explore together.

There are things we can do to make it more likely that younger people may come to our church, but I will need your help. I am aware that those reading this newsletter are from all different ages and stages of life. You may not be able to do much physically to help anymore, but you could pray or make phone calls. You may be active and dedicated to the church but wondering what else you could possibly add to your plate. You may be currently inactive and wondering if investing in the church again is worth your time and energy.

FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE:

It is obvious the COVID pandemic has taken a toll on all of us in one way or another. The same is true for our church finances. As we move into the second half of 2021, we are confident our church family will continue to come together, and the last half will look much better. Here are a few things to consider as we start the second half of this year:

- Checking account has decreased \$12,460 since the first of the year.
- Monthly expenses have averaged \$17,860.
- Monthly giving averaged \$13,750.
- The successful application to the Payroll Protection Program (\$30,200) is part of the giving average.

Bottom line, we are hopeful of making up \$16,000 plus during the second half of the year.

On a positive note, we still have a reasonably good balance in checking which will allow us to stay current with expenses. From our "Reserve Apportionments Account" we will pay the first half of our budgeted 2021 Apportionments (\$4,225.98). We also have a great staff that has worked hard to keep expenses inline. Again, we are confident that as our church continues to open up, with the start of Sunday School and other church events, we will weather this difficult time.

The next Finance Committee meeting will be set sometime the week of September 20th, at which time we will start the 2022 budget process. For all committees that are part of the budget, please review your 2022 needs and let us know if the current budgeted dollars are acceptable.

The committee wants to thank you for your support, and we pray for and appreciate your continued commitment to St. Paul's.
