## Missions Committee Fall "Food or Funds" Drive

It is that time of year when many of our thoughts turn to food and those traditional holiday favorites that make us smile. For some right here in our community, adequate food is a daily struggle. Let's see what St. Paul's can do to help! From October 27th through November 15th, the Missions



Committee will be conducting our annual fall food drive, "Food or Funds." In the past, we have surpassed our goal of gathering 500 items for distribution to the Cherokee food banks. This year, we will collect canned goods, non-perishable items, or gifts of cash until November 15th. Food can be collected in the shopping carts at church. Gifts of cash can be given by using the envelopes in the pews and marking it for "Food Drive," or by writing a check made out to St. Paul's with "Food Drive" on the memo line. All the food and funds will then be distributed to Mid Sioux, C.A.P., and the Trinity Lutheran Pantry.



The food pantry has let us know that they are in real need of things like Hamburger Helper, spaghetti sauce, and peanut butter. They also appreciate personal hygiene items, baby wipes, Kleenex, and paper products. Cash is often used to purchase meat or other items not on their shelves.

The shopping carts will be found in the church on the following Sundays: October 31st, November 7th, and November 14th. God loved. God gave. We love. We give.
