

A Moment With Mike

This Sunday, December 3rd, will mark the first Sunday of Advent. With Advent comes all of our traditions for Christmas planning and celebrating the season with special events and activities. I would guess there are at least some of you who include watching Christmas movies as a holiday tradition. There have been countless movies made through the years, but some are more long-lasting than others. This Advent, we will begin a sermon



series called "Christmas at the Movies." Each week, we will look at a different Christmas movie and see what it has to teach us about faith and life during the holiday season.

On December 3rd, we will look at the movie *Elf*. What is it that leads some to proclaim that this is the most wonderful time of the year? Is it the lights, the shopping, the cookies, the busyness? Or is it the feeling of goodwill—a revived sense of charity and generosity towards others? Just as Buddy had to help rekindle the joy of the season in his dad, it is good to remind ourselves that Christmas—in spite of its busyness and over commercialization—brings with it much to celebrate.

On December 10th, we will look at the movie Grinch. Do we have to be jolly at Christmas time? It sure seems that way. The culture leads us to feel guilty if we do not feel happy. The Grinch is usually seen as the bad guy in the story, and he is mean. Nonetheless, why does he hate Christmas so much? Is it Christmas itself he hates or the materialism and the overwhelming sense of fake happiness everyone seems to have during that time? If so, why isn't the Grinch happy? What should we do during the Christmas season when the jolly feeling has been stolen from us due to loss? Can we still have Christmas if we are sad and/or grieving?

On December 17th, we will look at the movie *Home Alone*. In this movie, Kevin is left home while his family goes on vacation. At first, this is fun, but soon Kevin finds himself in danger. However, he was never really alone. His scary neighbor turned out to be a hero, and his mother was working against all odds to get back to him. During the Christmas season, many feel alone and forgotten for various reasons. They are never truly alone, however. Although it may not always be evident, people do care, and God, like a mother determined to get home to her son, will always be with us. We are never truly alone.

On December 24th in the morning, we will look at the movie, The Nightmare Before Christmas. In this movie, Jack Skellington experiences the world of Christmas and wants to share his vision with his friends in Halloween Town. The problem is, none of them fully understand the vision, including himself, and things go horribly wrong. Nonetheless, there is redemption, and Christmas is saved, even if it looks a little different than normal. Looking beyond Christmas, life itself rarely goes as planned. This was certainly true for Mary and Joseph. How can we accept when things don't go the way we planned?

At our Christmas Eve service, we will look at the movie A Christmas Carol. The Christmas story is certainly powerful enough to change anyone. In A Christmas Carol, a man focused on the wrong things in life has a reorientation of his own through a series of visits from different Christmas ghosts. How can Christmas change our perspective on life?

I hope you can join us this Advent season as we prepare to worship Jesus, the newborn king.

Disaffiliations Update

Iowa Annual Conference Special Called Session Approves Disaffiliation of 59 United Methodist Churches

"Des Moines, IA — November 18, 2023 — The Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church held its final special session to vote on proposed Disaffiliation Agreements between the Iowa Annual Conference and United Methodist local churches seeking to leave The United Methodist Church. The session was held on Zoom Webinar.

The Resolution for the Approval of Disaffiliation Under Paragraph 2553 of the Book of Discipline sunsets at the end of 2023. The Book of Discipline outlines the polity of The United Methodist Church, including its organization and procedures. The vote passed by 96%. All the disaffiliation agreements can be viewed in the Resolution. It includes 59 Iowa churches that will no longer be a part of The United Methodist Church, effective November 30, 2023.

"Friends, it is time to bless those who have chosen to depart and to move on to a new day for The United Methodist Church in Iowa," said Bishop Kennetha Bigham-Tsai, Episcopal Leader of the Iowa United Methodist Church. "I look forward to the ways in which we will reach out to all people in our communities with a message of hope and in a spirit of love."

The vote comes after wider discussions in The United Methodist Church related to whether churches and clergypersons believe that LGBTQIA+ members should be allowed to marry and be ordained as clergypersons within the denomination, including a Special Session of the General Conference in 2019.

"This process provided an opportunity for congregations to have conversations about who they wanted to be," said Assistant to the Bishop Rev. Katie Dawson. "As we bless and release these churches, we have a sense of loss of the relationships and communities that have been part of our story. We are entering a new day where we can spend less time talking about this process and more time focused on where Jesus is leading us and how we are in ministry with the people in our communities. There is a fresh energy and spirit in The United Methodist Church here in Iowa as [we] reclaim our purpose."

Earlier this year, the Iowa Annual Conference held the first Special Called Conference that approved 83 disaffiliation agreements."

Summary: 142 United Methodist Churches in Iowa left our denomination in 2023. Conference staff reports this is approximately 19% of Iowa UM congregations.




Veterans Sunday Recognition






Commitment Sunday Update
