

#### A Moment with Mike

Our Iowa Annual Conference was held in West Des Moines on June 13th – 15th. Annual Conference is a time when clergy and laity from our Iowa churches get together to worship and to do the business of the church. I attended in person, and Linda Burkhart, our lay representative, attended online.

For me, the conference started with the clergy session Friday morning. This is a meeting of the clergy where votes are taken on such things as ordaining new clergy, celebrating the ministry of those retiring, etc. As the chair of the Conference Relations Committee, I was one of the presenters for a portion of the business. Friday afternoon, clergy and laity gathered for opening worship with a sermon given by our Bishop Kennetha J. Bigham-Tsai.

Other special events during the conference included a special presentation on Friday evening, all about how congregations in Iowa are and can respond to support immigrants in our midst who are facing the threat of deportation and/or imprisonment by our federal government. On Saturday, we had an educational presentation by Dr. Ashely Boggan D., the General Secretary of the General Commission on Archives and History. She recently authored a book about United Methodist history and how it can inform our witness today. On the same day, we also had a memorial service to honor clergy who have passed away in the last year, and in the evening, we had a celebration of ministries, in which different ministries of the conference were highlighted.

On Sunday morning, we had a worship service in which those retiring were recognized, those approved to be ordained were officially ordained, and an altar call was given for any who were feeling called to ministry to come forward. There were so many who came forward that they had to repeat the song they were playing to have time to speak to them all! Bishop Trimble, one of our previous bishops, preached the sermon.

In between these special events, we did the business of the church. This included things like approving nominations of people to various conference committees, approving the budget, passing legislation for our conference journal, and hearing reports from the Iowa United Methodist Foundation and the Board of Pensions, Cokesbury, and others. We approved amendments to the Book of Discipline that were passed at the last General Conference that would allow different regions of the world to adapt the Book of Discipline to their context of ministry. We also approved the conference purchasing a building for the French Ministry of Le Mars and Sioux City. This is a ministry that has been going strong and had been meeting in some United Methodist Churches that had disaffiliated. They needed a new home, so the purchase of a new building was approved, using funds that had been set aside for such a purpose, as this is still considered a mission church.

There is much more that took place at Annual Conference, more than I have space here to share, but to learn more, you may go to www.iaumc.org. All in all, Annual Conference is a great time to see clergy and laity that I have known from the past, but I am also glad to be back in Cherokee with all of you.

# **Cherokee Storm Damage**




