A big "thank you" goes to United Women in Faith and everyone else who prepared, served, and cleaned-up the meals. Following supper, the kids assembled in the sanctuary for opening worship. This included songs, led by Becky Lickiss, and a skit from DJ Cupcake (Ally Timmerman) and Top Chef (Madi Stief). Next, the kids split into groups to rotate through stations.
